

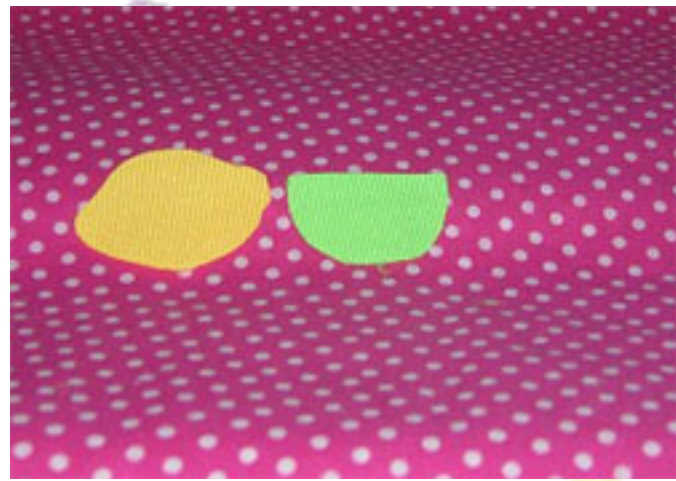

Fruit Bows

Using the method above. You can create any fruit shapes that you wish. A definite plus is to have fabric pain pens so that you can add some detail to your fruits like seeds to your apples and watermelons etc.

Cut out the shape of a Lemon for instance. That wouldn't really need anything else, fray check and put a little bow on the corner of the Lemon. Same thing with a Lime. You can make slices of Lemons and Limes, if you do that I would suggest using a white fabric paint pen and drawing segments on the slices and adding in a few pits here and there! Add a lil bow to the corner of it and you lined clippie to the back of the bow and you are done! Cute and

FAST!



If you want to make Grapes, I would cut out little circles and over lap them on each other and glue them. I would also add my grapes onto a larger bow for more stability.

Watermelons, Limes, Lemons, Apples, all can stand on their own. Just make sure that you don't forget to fold your ribbon over and glue your ribbon and let it dry before you start cutting! It will lend stability to the piece and be easier to cut that way! You really can come up with so many things this way, you are only limited to your imagination! :)
